Mgr Pat's Corner

You are called to bear much fruit

Fear stalks us daily. The world in which we live can undermine our trust in God. It is easy to become attached to things of this world even although, for the most part, they give us only fleeting pleasure or temporary security before they pass away or disappear altogether.

Since our heart is made for God, for the infinite, when we become attached to something that is not of God the result is fear: a fear of the future or a fear of the unknown. But with God we know the ending, and we know what awaits us. Listen to these words of Jesus: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away". All that we see and enjoy around us will one day disappear, but not Christ's promises, especially the promise of eternal life - and of heaven.

When Jesus spoke about the fig tree in today's Gospel, he may have thought of another fig tree - the one you may remember that bore no fruit, withered, dried up and died. Christ shocked his listeners at that time.

We don't know when Christ will pass by the fig tree of our life, looking to pick the fruit of our good works. However, we can be assured of this - the time will come. Our Baptism has made our lifetime a time of harvest. The lesson for today is: bear fruit now, be the best that you can be. Christ came to give life and give it abundantly!

Feasts and Solemnities

Monday 18th November - The Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul

Already in the twelfth century there was being celebrated today the anniversary of the dedication of the basilicas of St Peter at the Vatican and St Paul in the Via Ostiense by Pope St Silvester and Pope St Siricius in the fourth century. More recently this commemoration has been extended to the whole Church, honouring the two greatest apostles of Christ.

Thursday 21st November - The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

In unity with Eastern Christianity, and commemorating the dedication in 543 of the New Basilica of Saint Mary, built next to the Temple at Jerusalem, this feast celebrates Mary's "dedication" of herself to God from her infancy, inspired by the Holy Spirit, whose grace had filled her ever since her immaculate conception.

Friday 22nd November -St Cecilia (Martyr)

Devotion to St Cecilia, in whose honour a basilica was constructed in Rome in the fifth century, has spread far and wide because of the *Passion of Saint Cecilia*, which holds her up as a perfect example of a Christian woman, who embraced virginity and suffered martyrdom for the love of Christ.

Saturday 23rd November Pope St Clement I (Martyr)

Clement was Bishop of Rome after Peter, Linus and Cletus. He lived towards the end of the first century, but nothing is known for certain about his life. Clement's letter to the Corinthian church has survived. It is the first known Patristic document, and exhorts them to peace and brotherly harmony.
